### Intent

At Newlands, we want our pupils to have progressively covered the skills and concepts required in the National Curriculum. We aim to develop RE skills and British Values and to equip children for future life, encouraging them to have an understanding and a mutual respect and tolerance for their own and others beliefs. These key RE skills and concepts are: Living as a Christian, Christmas, The Bible, Easter, God, Jesus Christ and The Church. As well as learning about the key beliefs of Islam, Sikhism, Buddhism and Judaism

The coverage of RE in KS1 focuses on Christianity and Judaism, providing a foundation for KS2 teachers to build upon.

The intent in lower KS2 is that children will begin to understand the key concepts of Christianity and another faith.

Upper KS2 allows children to truly develop and embed these concepts whilst making links across faiths and to the world in which they live.

# <u>Implementation</u>

We have a comprehensive progression of skills in Christianity and RE document for staff to follow to best embed and cover every element of the RE national curriculum and the Nottinghamshire agreed syllabus. The knowledge/skills statements build year on year to deepen and challenge our children. Staff also use a range of planning and resourcing tools to teach our RE curriculum and to transfer these skills into all areas of work and school life.

## <u>Impact</u>

We encourage our children to enjoy and value the curriculum we deliver. We also look for evidence through the behaviour children demonstrate on a regular basis, their relationships with each other and adults, as well as their attitudes and opinions.

Progress within our RE curriculum is demonstrated through outcomes and the record of coverage in the process of achieving these outcomes. A variety of evidence for these outcomes can be seen published in children's topic books, on big sheets, photographs, on the school website and on school displays.
