Sticky Knowledge

To report online concerns - At school, we should tell the teacher or another adult. At home, we should tell a parent/guardian or a trusted adult. You can report concerns on websites - CEOP.

We maintain secure passwords by keeping them a secret and using both letters, numbers and characters to make a strong password. We shouldn't automatically save passwords on shared computers or devices.
