Secure site

Generally, secure websites use encryption and authentication standards to protect the confidentiality of web transactions

Phishing

The practice of sending email pretending to be from reputable companies in order to persuade individuals to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit cards numbers

Digital footprint

The information about a person that exists on the Internet as a result of their online activity.

Consent

to give assent or approval for something eg. an image to be used.

Online reputation

An online reputation, or e-reputation, is the reputation of a company, person, product, service or any other element on the Internet and digital platforms
