**Prime Minister:** the head of the government, the person in charge

**Law:** the rules a community lives by

**Patriotism:** national loyalty, support for your country

**Loyalty:** being faithful to a country or government

**Citizenship:** belonging to a country, calling a country 'home'

**National anthem:** a song/hymn used by a nation to foster loyalty

**Suffragette:** a woman who believes women have the right to vote in the same way men do

**Citizen:** a person who 'belongs' to a country. They are usually born there but can move there and learn the ways of the country and apply to be a citizen

**Monarch:** the king, queen or emperor of a country

**Immigration:** the process of moving to a new country to live
