1864-1944

Kandinsky was one of the first painters to stop painting pictures of real things and paint using colours and shapes.

He would often listen to music while he painted and try to paint what he heard.

Klee painted using bold colours in a style of abstract art called 'cubism'.

He also used a style called pointillism, using thousands of tiny dots to paint a whole picture.

A **pattern** is a repeated decorative design.

Tone is how light or dark something is. Artists use black, white and grey tones to show how light or dark a colour appears. Kandinsky and Klee were famous for being pioneers in abstract art.

Lines

Lines are created by drawing from one place to another.

Vertical: a straight line going from top to bottom.

Horizontal: a line going directly from side to side.

Diagonal: a line joining two opposite corners.

Straight: with no curves or bends.

Curved: rounded or bent.

Spiral: winding in a continuous curve around a central point.

Wavy: a line that smoothly curves in and out in a repetitive motion.

Loops: circular shaped lines.

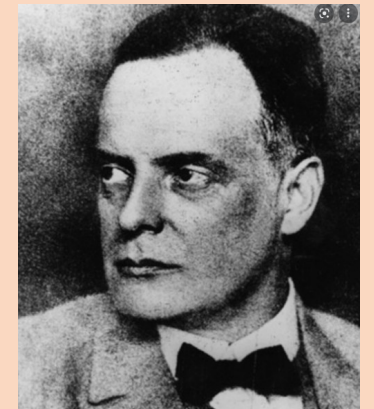
Dots: a small round mark or spot.

Dashes: a series of small horizontal lines.

Zig zag: a line having alternate right and left turns.
