

STICKY KNOWLEDGE/VOCABULARY

There are a range of techniques used when working with wire.

Sculpture: producing 3D objects.

Armature: the skeleton or framework of a sculpture.

Form: objects that are 3D, or have length, width, and height.

Shape: a form or a figure.

Scale: the size of the sculpture.

Proportion: the relative size of one thing to another.

Texture: the feel of the surface (e.g rough, smooth).

Flexible: a material that can be bent or moulded into different shapes.

Layer: place one sheet of material on top of another.

Soak: immerse in a liquid.

Squeeze: firmly press.

Pinch: to squeeze/press between the finger and thumb.

Join: to fix two or more things together.

Wrap: to cover or enclose something.

Twist: to rotate/turn around repeatedly.

Hook: to curve or bend back at an angle.

Loop: a circular shape made by bending a material round.

Braid: to weave two or more strands in and out of each other.

Bend: a curved shape or line.
