KEY VOCABULARY

Oil: a type of paint which is mixed with oil to bind it together

Watercolour: a type of paint which is mixed with water to create a watery effect.

Impressionism: an art movement categorised by small, thin brush movements.

Romanticism: a type of art work focused on emotions, feelings and moods.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE

Monet was an impressionist who used small touches of pure colour rather than broader strokes.

Paintings capture 'glances' of images.

John Constable was a romanticist who wanted to show nature and beauty rather than industrialisation.

JOHN CONSTABLE

(1776-1837)

Constable is famous for his landscapes, which are mostly of the Suffolk countryside, where he was born and lived.

He made many open-air sketches, using these as a basis for his large exhibition paintings, which were worked up in the studio.

His pictures are extremely popular today, but they were not particularly well received in England during his lifetime.
