
Fundamental Skills: Christmas Home Learning Activities

1. Catch it!


To save time, the toys and presents are often thrown between the different areas of the workshop by the elves. To be an elf, you're catching and reaction skills must be spot on!

Try to catch a ball delivered by a friend or family member when it has been:

- thrown high into the air;
- thrown low to the ground;
- · thrown out to the left and to the right;
- rebounded off a wall;
- bounced on the floor;
- thrown underarm;
- thrown overarm;
- bowled;
- thrown while your back is turned (on the signal, turn around to catch it).

Try these catches with both hands and then with just your right hand and just your left hand.

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
2. Throwing for distance

Throwing for distance is not only important for moving items around the workshop but also for break times when you go outside to throw snowballs! It is good to be able to use your non-dominant hand as well as your dominant hand for throwing.

Practise throwing a ball or beanbag overarm with your left and right hand. Can you throw further with one hand than the other?

Spend time trying to improve the distance you can throw with both hands.

How did you do?




3. Throwing for accuracy

Accurate throwing is just as important for elves as being able to throw items for distance.

Using scrunched up newspaper or socks, aim for a target (such as a bin or bucket) using the underarm throw. To begin with, start two metres away. You can move further away to add more of a challenge or closer to make it easier. Try throwing with both your left and your right hand.

4. Can the elves reach the shelves?

It is important to be able to reach all the shelves in the workshop. Sometimes the elves might have to jump to be able to do this.

Practise the vertical standing jump to see how high you can reach. If you have a wall you can use, get a friend or family member to measure how high you can jump and then you can try to beat that height.
