VOCABULARY

Society: a group of people living together in an ordered community.

Contribute: to give money or other resources to a charity.

Charity: a group that gives time, money or actions to help others who need it.

Aid: to give support or help to those who need it.

Saving: this is what you do in order to be able to afford to buy something—you keep some of your money every week/month to one side until you have enough saved.

Voluntary: something that is done through choice with no money paid for doing it.
