VOCABULARY

Society: a group of people living together in an ordered community.

Contribute: to give money or resources to a charity. Charity: a group that gives time, money or actions to help others who need it.

Aid: to give support or help to those who need it.

International: when something is international, it takes place in several countries.

Responsibility: a responsibility is something you have to do or look after.

Saving: this is what you do in order to be able to afford to buy something — you keep some of your money every week/month to one side until you have enough saved. Voluntary: something that is done through choice with no money paid for doing it.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE

Children who look after their money and save some will realise that, in the future, they will be able to save money in order to afford bigger items.

The Fiver Challenge is a programme that helps bring the business world to life for primary school pupils. Children use a £5 pledge to get their business ideas off the ground during the challenge, aiming to make as much profit as they can. They work together to decide what product or service they'll invest their fivers in.

Teams need to source materials or products, prepare sales pitches, and plan selling events.

Once the product or service is ready, they prepare for the selling event. At the end of the challenge, pupils repay their £5 pledges and decide how to spend or donate their profit.
