VOCABULARY

Stereotype: an assumed view of someone or something

Challenge: ask people to explain their views

Assertive: positive

Destructive: negative and hurtful

Prejudice: a preconceived unfavourable opinion (the wrong one)

Discrimination: treating someone unfairly or nastily

Tolerance: treating everyone fairly and equally

Harassment: continually being nasty

Protected Characteristics: specific parts of someone's identity

Prohibit: stop something or someone from doing something

STICKY KNOWLEDGE

Always use manners and show courtesy towards others.

Stereotypes can be unfair, negative and destructive. Always challenge prejudice and discrimination by treating everyone fairly and with respect and tolerance.

Discrimination and harassment are prohibited under the 2002 Equality Act.

Protected characteristics are: Age, Disability, Gender, Race, Religion, Sex and Sexual orientation.

LGBT stands for:

Lesbian (two females)

Gay (two men)

Bisexual (love for both sexes)

Transgender (people whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth)
