

Timbre	What makes a particular musical instrument or human voice have a different sound from another, even when they play or sing the same note
Texture	Texture is the mixing and layering of sounds. It makes the music more interesting to listen to.
Structure	The order of the music
Ensemble	Playing or singing in a group
Soundscape	A collection of sounds from an environment layered for atmosphere/effect
Lyric	Lyrics are words that make up a song usually consisting of verses and choruses.
Melody	The tune, made up of high and low pitched notes played/sung one after the other.
