

Key Knowledge and Understanding

Experimental music is an experimental technique of music composition, which uses recorded sounds as their source material.

A **found sound** is a sound you can record from the world around you – it could be anything you like, from the noise of a car to a bird or a door.

Composers can use lots of varied techniques to alter and develop the source material, like chopping it up in to bits, playing it backwards, using special effects in the studio etc.

The opening number of a television show has a big job to do. It has to convey, in a very short amount of time, the mood of the show you're about to watch, possibly introduce you to the characters, and set the tone for the next 30 to 60 minutes. But more than anything, it has to hook you.

A way of recording music using pictures or symbols

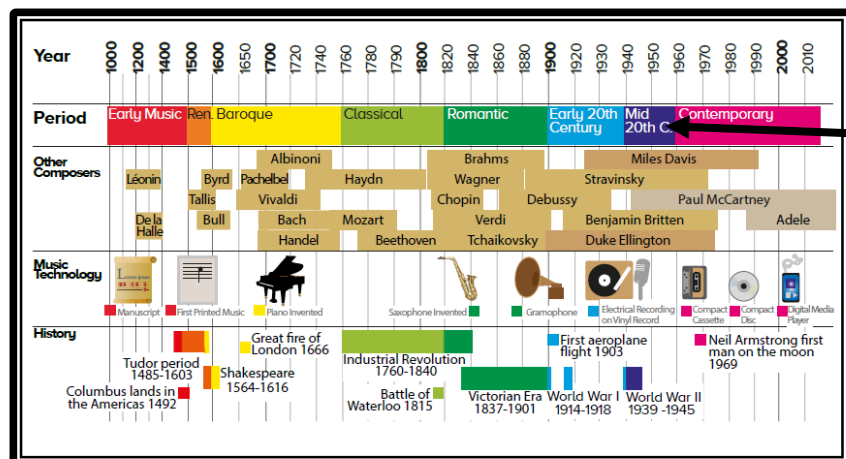

Delia Derbyshire

Delia Ann Derbyshire was an English musician and composer of electronic music. She carried out pioneering work with the BBC Radiophonic Workshop during the 1960s, including her electronic arrangement of the theme music to the British science-fiction television series Doctor Who.



During the 1960s, several musical genres gained mainstream popularity. Among them were rock and roll, folk rock, rhythm and blues, and anti-war music.
