STICKY KNOWLEDGE - BAPTISM

Baptism is a ceremony performed by Christian churches. It shows that the person being baptized has become a follower of Jesus.

Jesus was baptized by <u>John the Baptist</u>. The usual form of baptism among the earliest Christians was for the person to be immersed totally or partially and this is still carried out on older children/adults.

When babies are baptized, it is the parents and godparents who make the promises for the baby.

Baptism can take place in a Font or baptismal pool.

The symbols associated with baptism are:

- a white garment (which symbolises putting on the purity of Christ)
- water (which symbolises washing away sins and starting afresh)
- the sign of the cross (made on a baby's head with water to remember Jesus's sacrifice to us)
- a candle (which symbolises Jesus, the light of the world. His presence will burn throughout our lives.)

Christians worship in a church and Hindus in a Mandir or at home.

Christian leaders are called Priests or Vicars.

Hindus have SADHU (holy men), PUJARI and PUROHIT (temple leaders).
