KEY VOCABULARY

Confirmation	The act or process of confirming or proving.
Communion	The part of a Christian service that honours the last supper of Jesus and his apostles.
Enactment	The act or process of acting something out that has already happened.
Chalice	A drinking goblet, that is used for the Eucharist wine.
Veil	A thin piece of fabric or net worn over the face, head, or shoulders, or over some combination of these. A veil is used as a decoration or to hide a person's face.
Quote	To repeat a passage or information that someone else said or wrote.
Altar	A raised table or platform used for religious ceremonies.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE– COMMUNION

Confirmation or First Holy Communion is a special church service in which a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptized.

Holy Communion is a re-enactment of the last supper.

People who take Holy Communion eat bread to remember the body of Jesus and drink wine to remember his blood. When we take communion, we are remembering Jesus' sacrifice on the cross.

When given the bread and wine the vicar/priest will quote Jesus saying, "Do this in remembrance of me." Jesus uttered these words at the last meal which He shared with His disciples before His death.

Usually children between 8 and 12 are confirmed or take first Holy communion. It is a special day. You have to attend classes before and have a rehearsal. Girls wear a white dress and veil to represent purity and boys wear a special tie.

Know Jews worship in a Synagogue and the religious leader is a Rabbi.
