Holy Week

The week immediately before Easter Sunday.

Crucifixion

A method of execution in which the condemned person is tied or nailed to a cross.

Tomb

A hole in which a dead body is buried; grave.

Resurrection

The return to life of Jesus Christ after he died and was buried.

Betrayal

To not be loyal or faithful.

STICKY KNOWLEDGE - THE LAST SUPPER

Jesus was crucified on the cross and was resurrected.
Judas betrayed Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane by kissing him and addressing him as "rabbi" to reveal his identity in the darkness to the crowd who had come to arrest him.

Peter denied knowing Jesus three times to the arresting guards.

Mary Magdalene was a faithful follower of Jesus. She witnessed the crucifixion and burial of Jesus, and was the first person to see and talk with him after he arose from the dead. She told the apostles that she had seen him.

Pontius Pilot is the Roman Governor who ordered the crucifixion of Jesus.
