



## Prevent Action Plan 2024 – 26

The Prevent Counter Terrorism strategy has been put in place by the Government in response to the threat of terrorism and to protect and educate our young people to prevent them being drawn into extremist ideology.

The strategy will specifically:

- respond to the ideological challenge of terrorism and the threat we face from those who promote it
- prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support
- work with sectors and institutions where there are risks of radicalisation which we need to address

Schools have a duty to ensure the following:

- That they provide a single point of contact in school for Prevent
- They assess the risk of students being drawn into extreme and terrorist activities
- Develop an action plan to reduce the risk
- Train staff to recognise radicalisation and extremism
- To refer vulnerable people to Channel
- To prohibit extremist speakers and events
- To prevent access to extremist materials

This is a responsibility for all schools, no matter what kind of community they serve and comes under safeguarding/ child protection principles.

The following action plan is our response to the duty to plan to address and minimise the risk to our children and community.

<b>Training</b>	Ensure training is carried out by teaching and support staff so that they understand the PREVENT agenda and how to respond to extremism and radicalisation. 	Staff continue to use every opportunity to embed British Values within the curriculum. Links are made across the curriculum, through the school values and during assemblies.	Children are well prepared for life in multicultural Britain and demonstrate an appreciation of others.	Immediately	Ongoing
<b>Curriculum and E-safety</b>	The Safe Internet Policy references reporting inappropriate content of an extremist nature.	Both parents and children know what to do should they encounter extremist materials online. Parents are prepared for protecting their children at home.	Autumn 24	Ongoing
	Filtering is continuously reviewed to ensure that it is robust enough to filter extremist sites.	Children and staff are protected from being able to access extremist sites in school.	Autumn 24	Ongoing
	A log is kept of any inappropriate content which may be accessed. This is reported to our IT provider who is able to put further filters in place.	Any discrepancies are addressed immediately.	Autumn 24	Ongoing
	School takes every opportunity to promote diversity and traditional British values throughout the curriculum and to make links to children's lives in modern Britain.	Children are well prepared to take a full and active part within multicultural British society, recognise stereotyping and reject it.	Immediately	Ongoing
<b>School Environment</b>	Appropriate guidance is used to governing the events organised in school by staff, children and visitors.	No event is held which supports extremist views or promotes radicalisation or is contrary to British Values.	Immediately	Sept 26
	Books, resources and displays throughout school represent all groups equally and help children to respect and understand others.	School is a safe environment which promotes harmony and British values.	Immediately	Ongoing
